Carl Gustav Jung (/ ʃ ʊ ŋ / YUUNG, German: [kaʁl ˈjʊŋ]; 26 July 1875 – 6 June 1961) was a Swiss psychiatrist and psychoanalyst who founded analytical psychology. Jung's work was influential in the fields of psychiatry, anthropology, archaeology, literature, philosophy, and religious studies. Jung worked as a research scientist at the famous Burghölzli hospital, under Eugen Bleuler.

Jung was originally a supporter of his mentor Sigmund Freud. The relationship eventually fractured over Jung's criticism of Freud's emphasis on sexuality during development, which led Jung to develop his own psychoanalytic approach known as analytical psychology.

Jungian psychology offers two related methods: dream work and active imagination. Dream Work. Dreams, Jung found, are the gateway through which the unconscious communicates with our conscious mind. Our inner Wise Old Man or Woman (the Self) knows what's best for us. The Self, however, cannot communicate in language. Instead, it uses symbols and images.
